Kiambethu Tea Farm

Go back in time, back to the African colonial period...

Only 40km north of the heart of Nairobi, the smell of car fume and human noise will be replaced by a world of green tea plantations and an unrecognizable scent of fresh green tea will hit you. Out on the miles long plantations your eyes will meet a sight of tiny almost invisible people, who walks the small trails and picks the fresh tea leaves.

Somewhere among bushes, big trees and the green tea plantations is a little gem, a tea farm with more than 100 years of history, the farm is Kiambethu Tea Farm. The farm that has been inherited for 5 generations is today owned by Fiona Vernon, who will take you on a journey back in time, back to 1903 where it all began.

On this trip, you will also get a tour around the farm and the nearby tea plantations. A trip to the tea plantations is a must when you are around here, on these tea plantations the scent of fresh tea will once again hit you, while a guide tells you about the many different types of tea, how they are produced and how they have been using the nature for medicine. You will get the chance to pick some fresh tea from the big green bushes and feel the leaves between your hands.

Among beautiful flower bushes, big avocado trees and drilian monkeys, who play around in the tree tops and on the roof of the farm, you will be able to enjoy a freshly made tea, like nothing you have never tasted before and a lunch in the magnificent surroundings, all while the farm owner, Fiona Vernon, tells the story and how she has experienced it, as the granddaughter of Arnold Butler McDonell.
